January 13, 1958

A board of directors meeting was called by the president and held at his home. Those present were: John Stick, Dr. Lutes, Max Bruensteiner, Otto Crader, Elyga Wenger and Duane Smith.

A condition was brought to the attention of the board by Elyga Wenger that would suggest a membership committee might be desirable in keeping any persons from becoming members who might hurt the club. Some discussion followed as to best handle such a condition and a motion was made by John Stick, second by Max Bruensteiner and carried that all applications be presented to the board and approved and passed by the board for membership into the club. Refer to letter dated Nov. 27, 57 to M. Bruensteiner.

The club was originally founded to give members of PSA who were interested in Stereo a club since it was understood that Beverly Hills and Pasadena were closed clubs at the time. When the name PSA Stereo Club of Southern California as a name was suggested it had the approval of top names here locally. Since October 1956 when we paid our dues to PSA, we have been asked to change the club name and the check that Ina Lank sent headquarters has been lost - that is, as we are told. Since we have not received a reply from a letter Dr. Lutes sent the President of PSA a number of months ago, it was decided to ignore the request, and send our dues for both years with a letter to the effect that we wished to bring our dues up to date with PSA. John Stick offered to handle this matter for the club. A motion was made by Dr. Lutes, second by Otto Crader and carried that John Stick send a letter to headquarters and render a check for club dues to PSA for the two years concerned.

The board authorized the Treasurer to pay Alhambra Camera Shop for stereo glasses bought for the club.

It was suggested that a club Roster would be desirable for all members to have. The secretary is to make up a stencil for such a roster.

Programs for the first part of the year was discussed.

February - Competition ---- Karl Struss, Judge. Secretary to write to him.

March - PSA Traveling Stereo Salon

April - Mounting ---- Dr. Lutes and Mrs. Wenger

May - Public Ehibition of Stereo Salon - ?

It was noted that possibly such new members as D. P. Loye, Mrs. Faxon and Mr. Gehrig might have slides to make up show for a program.

June 19, 1958 - S4C banquet. It was decided to, at least show Stereo winners by means of 2D this year, even though there might be only a few.

Business of the evening completed, the meeting was adjourned.

Elyga Wenger, Sec.

A special board meeting was called prior to the Salon meeting called for the same night at the home of the president. Those present were: Dr. Lutes, John Stick, Max Bruensteiner, Ina Lank and Elyga Wenger.

A letter was read by John Stick from PSA Headquarters that acknowledged our membership for the year of 1956-57 and 1957-58.

John Stick reported that the Traveling Salon has been scheduled for us for March of 1959 and presented a bill for postage for both the mailing of it for this year and next.

Dr. Lutes presented a bill for two projector bulbs.

A motion was made by Elyga Wenger that the club extend to Dr. Lutes a paid-up membership - till July 1, 1958 - for the continued use of his projector at all previous club meetings. The motion was second by Ina Lank and carried.

The board authorized Max Bruensteiner to pay The Alhambra Camera Shop for additional glasses ordered by the president.

The application for membership of Paul Simone was presented to the membership committee and considered. A motion was made by John Stick, second by Ina Lank and carried that the application for membership be rejected. The secretary to notify Paul Simone of the board's decision.

A motion was made by Dr. Lutes, second by John Stick and carried that the following memberships be approved by the membership committee: G. E. Crocker, Mr. and Mrs. I. Vinson, L. Hoyle, C. E. Wiencke, Abe Meyer, C. Fine, F. Schwankee, E. E. De Caussin, S. O'Brien, B. Reddock, M. Wright and M. Mc Craw.

A motion was made by Max Bruensteiner, second by Elyga Wenger and carried that an application for membership that has been rejected can not be considered more than once a year.

Meeting was adjourned.

June 25, 1958

At a regular meeting of The PSA Stereo Club of Southern California nominations for new officers was presented to the members by the nominating committee chairman, Dr. Harold Lutes as followes: President, Mrs. Elyga Wenger - Vice-President, Robert Hartung - Secretary, Shirley Smith - Treasure, Victor Gehrig and S4C Delegate, Otto Crader.

Hubert Reeves made a motion that the nominations made be

accepted, it was second by John Stick and carried.

Since there were no further nominations from the floor by members, Hubert Reeves again made a motion that the nominations made by the nominating committee be accepted and that the nominations be closed. The motion was second by James Dinwiddie and accepted unanimously.

Dear Mel:

As you know, there is a sizeable number of very enthusiastic stereographers in the Los Angeles area. Sometime previous to two years ago, a group of them, headed then by Dr. Harold Lutes, APSA, formed together into a stereo camera club. The chosen name for this club was, and is, the PSA Stereo Club of Southern California.

The initials PSA were deliberately included in the name, for this club required that each of it's members also be a full-fledged member of the national Photographic Society of America. The officers of the club have long been loyal and strong promoters of PSA; and they hoped that the inclusion of the initials PSA in their club name would help enforce their all-PSA membership requirement. From personal acquaintance with some of the club officers, I have been impressed with their sincereity of interest in the welfare of PSA, and their concern over it's national and local membership problems.

Approximately two years ago this club, thru Ina Lank, Treasurer, applied for membership in PSA and forwarded the necessary membership fees, to Headquarters in Philadelphia. However, acceptance into national PSA membership was delayed until only recently. Even then, I understand that/Effeir membership certificate, the initials "PSA" in the club's name were deleted.

You are familiar with many of the people in the PSA SCofSC, and you are also aware of some of the details I have outlined above, I have repeated them, however, for the benefit of the record; and for any other readers of this letter who may not be familiar with the background.

You will also recall that I brought this matter to the attention of the PSA National Board at it's Annual 1957 meeting at the St. Louis Convention. At that time it was the opinion of Headquarters officers that acceptance of the PSA SCofSC into PSA would not be desirable because of possible liability reverting to National PSA in the event of misdemeanors on the part of the local PSA SCofSC.

I have since sought the advice of a nationally-known trademark, copyright, and organizational lawyer on the questions raised at St. Louis. The results of a long conversation with him could be briefly summed as follows:

1. National PSA has the right by usage, if it elects, to prevent camera clubs from incorporating the initials "PSA" in the camera club names.

- 2. However, there are many similar instances in which national organizations give right to local organizations to assume all or part of the national name, yet without incurring liability to the national organization.
 - a. Witness the many technical societies. There are many local named A.S.T.E. (American Society of Tool Engineers) chapters of national A.S.T.E.; but any financial irregularities of a local chapter are not assumed by the national headquarters.
 - b. Witness the many national fraternities. The local boys of my Sigma Alpha Epsilon chapter (for example) can get in all kinds of scrapes, but they will not necessarily be bailed out by National Headquarters.
- 3. National PSA could grant right to use of the PSA initials, without incurring liability, by requiring each applying camera club to include a By-Law in the club's constitution absolving National PSA of any liability. One copy of such constitution should be filed with national PSA at the time of club membership application.
- 4. National PSA's own constitution could absolve itself of liability for acts of member clubs. As a matter of fact, it may already be covered in Article VI, Section 8, where it states: "SCOPE OF AUTHORITY. No officer, official member, (underlining is mine) or employee of this Society shall commit this Society as a whole to any policy, agreement, responsibility, project, undertaking, or unauthorized expense without the approval of the Board of Directors" If Article VI, Section 8, is not restrictive enough, a new amendment could be made covering the requirement.

Therefore, the way appears clear to permit the PSA SCofSC to include the initials PSA in it's name just as it has been doing, yet without liability to national PSA. I hoped to bring this information to the attention of the PSA Board of Directors at the Semi-Annual meeting in Philadelphia last April, but you will recall that the meeting lasted into the evening in order to handle only the regular business. However, the information was briefly passed on by word of mouth to Headquarters officers, and it was perhaps helpful in the recent decision to admit the PSA SCofSC into PSA.

Regardless of, or perhaps because of, recent Headquarters' action; it seems desirable to explore the possibilities of this case at greater length. It is possible that much broader good could accrue to national PSA thru promotion of all-PSA camera clubs.

We all recognize that membership, particularly continued membership, is one of PSA's major problems. I'm sure we'd all welcome an acceptable suggestion which might increase PSA membership by as much as 10%, or retain an equivalent number of "drop-outs". Yet I'm not being facetious in saying that this possibility is within our reach if we'd follow the lead of the PSA SCofSC (and several other camera clubs which also require 100% PSA membership).

The officers of the PSA SCofSC point out that there are at present no widespread local PSA activities which provide an incentive to remain in PSA. Admittedly, there are regional and national Conventions, but I believe it's true that you don't have to be a PSA member to register and attend, and the conventions occur infrequently. There are also PSA Chapters, but these are limited to large towns or

areas, and are less tightly organized than local camera clubs. As it stands now, there are no PSA organizations at the <u>local</u> level which provide the same benefits and familiarity of membership and activity as does a local camera club. Recall, too, that camera clubs are numerous, and they offer a means to reach into every small U.S. community.

The officers of the PSA SCofSC also point out that PSA needs a local activity incentive to keep members in national PSA. If a PSA "fringe" member finds that he is provided the enjoyment of personal (not by mail) activity by being a member of national PSA, then he will continue his membership.

All this can be provided. It would occur if local camera club members were also required to be members of PSA. It has proven true that many camera ALAB enthusiasts are willing to pay combined "local club-PSA" dues in order to retain the pleasure of local activities, and the distinction of belonging to an all-PSA club. Thus the member automatically associates advantages from PSA membership with the personal pleasures of local photographic activity.

So far all this has perhaps sounded feasible...but you have a right to ask, "What's going to force a camera club to require PSA membership from it's members? And if they do so, won't the blub face a loss of some of it's members?"

Therein lies the necessary key. There still needs to be provided an incentive for any camera club to become an all-PSA camera club. However, the PSA SCofSC has provided it for themselves...in the privilege and the pleasure derived from including the initials "PSA" in their club name. They apparently place a sizeable value on this, for they've fought for two years for retention of these initials. Furthermore, and perhaps more important, the PSA SCofSC officers feel thay they have suffered no loss of membership by requiring national PSA membership of each club member. All this in spite of the fact that they have not had national blessing on their efforts to promote PSA.

What would be an appropriate incentive for any camera club to require all-PSA membership? I think it can be provided, and I would like to propose it for consideration at the coming Annual Meeting of the Board of Directors in Philadelphia.

I suggest that a new class of camera club Honors be set up within the framework of PSA Honors. I suggest that an Honors designation of FFA CPSA (Camera Club of PSA) be originated. I suggest that any camera club reaching 100% PSA membership be permitted to append these initials to it's name, just as individual members can earn and proudly use the initials APSA or FPSA. The PSA SCofSC might then be known as The Stereo Club of Southern California, CPSA.

I'm sure I need not list all the benefits from such a system. It would, obviously, result in active proposed promotion of PSA by many camera clubs. It would provide a distinctive level of camera clubs, to which individual members could "step up" from non-all-PSA clubs. It would provide other ultimate improvement in camera club prestige and operation. Above all, it would provide an increase of perhaps 10% in PSA membership (wouldn't it be possible for 50 camera clubs to enlist an additional 20 members each?). More important, it would keep members in PSA.

I'm sure that the officers of the PSA SCofSC, as well as myself, would appreciate serious consideration by the PSA Board of Directors on two parts of the above proposals:

1. That the PSA SCofSC be accorded full membership privileges in PSA.

2. That a system be devised to provide incentive for camera clubs to "sell" PSA to their members. The above proposal is one such system; there may be others which would be equally desirable and effective.

In the event a club Honors system such as I have proposed is ever set up, I would personally urge that the No. 1 Certificate of Honor be awarded to the PSA Stereo Club of Southern California.

I am enclosing three extra copies of this letter in the event you wish to forward copies to the Chairmen of the Nonors Committee, Membership Committee, or Camera Club Committee.

Thank you very much for your attention to this long communication. I'll look forward to your comments, and to seeing you in Philadelphia.
