STEREO CLUB OF SOUTHERN CALIFORNIA

BY-LAWS

ARTICIE I - NAME AND PURPOSE

- Section 1 NAME. This organization shall be known as STEREO CLUB OF SOUTHERN CALIFORNIA, a non-profit organization.
- Section 2 PURPOSE. The club is organized for the purpose of promoting the enjoyment of the art of photography; to have organized discussion; to hold competitions in various branches of photography; to arrange for assistance to its members in the form of speakers, demonstrations or other means of furthering this enjoyment and enhancing the skill of its members; to arrange field trips; to buy and own such properties as the directors deem necessary for the fulfillment of these aims.

ARTICLE II - MEMBERSHIP

- Section 1 MEMBERSHIP. Any person of good character, who is interested in photography, may be admitted to regular membership by the Board of Directors, upon filing application and payment of dues as prescribed in Section 2 of this article.
- Section 2 DUES. The annual dues shall be set by the Board of Directors.

The fiscal year starts July 1st of each year and ends on June 30th of the following year. Dues shall be paid annually, and in advance. If any member's dues remain unpaid on September 1st of such year, said member may be suspended by the Board of Directors. The suspension shall be lifted automatically, upon payment of dues in arrears. Dues must be paid up to date, to participate in the Club competitions or activities.

For anyone accepted to regular membership between January 1st and June 30th of any year, the dues shall be one-half the annual dues.

- Section 3 ASSESSMENTS. Additional funds may be obtained by assessment of the Club members. A notice shall be issued to all members, at least one week before a proposed assessment is to be voted on. The vote on the proposed assessment will take place at a regularly-scheduled meeting of the Club, and a majority vote of the members present will be necessary for approval.
- NEW MEMBERSHIP IN SOUTHERN CALIFORNIA COUNCIL OF CAMERA CLUBS. Realizing membership in the Council is bebeficial both to the members and
 the Club, each new member shall pay, in addition to the annual dues,
 an initiation fee, said initiation fee shall be used for payment of his
 or her membership to the ShC. This initiation fee will be in the amount of members' dues in the ShC at the time of application, if between July 1st and December 31st. If application is received between
 January 1st and June 30th, the amount shall be one-half of the amount
 of the annual dues in the ShC.

Section 5 SUSPENSION AND RECALL. A majority vote of the Board of Directors of the Club may expell a member of the Club, or recall an elected or appointed officer of the Club.

ARTICLE III - BOARD OF DIRECTORS

- Section 1 NUMBER. The Board of Directors shall consist of four (4) persons nemely, President, Vice President, Secretary, and Treasurer. They shall be elected in accordance with Section 3 of this Article, and shall have full power to manage the affairs of this organization, subject to the provisions of law and these By-Laws. They shall make such rules and regulations as they deem proper to carry on the business of this organization.
- Section 2 TERM. The Directors shall serve for one year, from July 1st, following his or her election or untill a successor has been elected and qualified. Re-election is permissable.
- Section 3 NOMINATION AND ELECTION. The President shall appoint, not later than March of each year, a Nominating Committee, of no less than three (3) members, who shall be approved by the Board of Directors. The Chairman shall be a member of the Board of Directors.

The Committee shall submit to the Board of Directors, not later than the regular April Meeting, a list of candidates for the Directorships to be filled. The Board shall instruct the Editor of the Club publication, if there is one, to publish the names of the candidates, at least thirty (30) days in advance of the annual election.

Additional nominations may be made from the floor, at the Annual Election meeting, by any member, subject to either of two conditions: FIRST, the person being nominated is present at the meeting and gives his or her consent; or SECOND, that the nominee shall have given the nominator his or her written consent to the nomination and said written consent is submitted to the Secretary, at the time of the nomination.

Election of Directors shall take place at the last general meeting of June of each year. If more nominations are made from the floor, election shall be by secret ballot. The President shall appoint three (3) tellers to count the ballots and announce the results.

- Section 4 BOARD MEETINGS. The Board of Directors shall hold meetings periodically, at the call of the President, or at the call of two (2) Directors.
- Section 5 QUORUM. Three (3) Directors shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of any business.
- Section 6 VACANCIES. Vacancies on the Board shall be filled by appointment of the President, with the approval of the Board of Directors, and those appointed shall serve untill their successors are elected and qualified, at the next Annual Meeting.

- Section 7 COMPENSATION. The officers shall serve without compensation. The compensation of any employee shall be set by the Board of Directors.
- Section 8 SPECIAL MEETINGS. The President or three (3) of the directors may call a special meeting of the Board of Directors, at any time, by delivering or mailing to the last known address of each director a written or printed notice of such meeting, at least three (3) days prior to the meeting.

ARTICLE IV - OFFICERS

- Section 1 PRESIDENT. The President shall preside at all regular and special meetings of the Club and the Board of Directors. Subject to the approval of the Board of Directors, he or she shall have general control and management of the affairs of the Club, and shall apoint all committees, He or she shall be ex-official member of all committees, except the Nominating Committee.
- Section 2 VICE PRESIDENT. The Vice President shall preside at all regular and special meetings of the Board of Directors and Club meetings, in the absence of the President; and, in general, assume the duties and obligations of the President in such absence.
- Section 3 SECRETARY. The Secretary shall keep a record of all proceedings in regular and special meetings of the Board of Directors, and within five (5) days after such meeting, he or she shall mail to the President a copy of the Minutes of the meeting. He or she shall send out all notices of regular or special meetings of the Board of Directors. He or she shall perform such other duties as are assigned to him or her by the Board of Directors, and the President.
- Section 4 TREASURER. The Treasurer shall safely keep all the monies of the organization, that comes into his or her hands, from time to time, and pay out the same upon checks of the organization, for all bills duly contracted and authorized to be paid, and generally perform all duties pertaining to his or her office, or which may be required of him or her by the Board of Directors. He or she shall keep accurate books of account of all transactions of his or her office. He or she shall make a report at all regular Directors: meetings, or when requested by the President.

ARTICLE V - LIABILITY

Section 1 LIABILITY. Participation in outings, meetings, and all other activities arranged by the Club is, on a voluntary basis, and is at the individual discretion of the persons who are associated with the members or their guests. Accordingly, the STEREO CLUB OF SOUTHERN CALIFORNIA, its officers, its Directors, either singly or jointly, assume no liability, either direct or implied, for damage or injury to the person or property of the individuals while participating in activities of the Club; and, further, the Club or its officers or directors assume no liability for damage or injury of third parties, due to wilful act or negligence of any person participating in Club activities.

ARTICLE VI - AMENDMENT

Section 1 PROCEDURE. These By-Laws may be amended by the following procedure. The proposal may be made in writing, to the Board of Directors, by any director, or by a Resolution signed by not fewer than ten (10) members. The President shall submit the proposal to the Board of Directors at the next regular meeting. If two-thirds (2/3rds) of the directors present at the meeting approve, the Amendment shall be submitted to the members of the Club, either by mail or at the next regular meeting of the Club. A copy of the existing By-Laws, together with the proposed changes, shall be published in the Club publication, no less than the month preceding the regular meeting.

Two-thirds (2/3rds) of the members present at the meeting must approve the Amendment.

Before being voted upon, any proposed Amendment may be changed, by a majority vote of the members present, provided such changes do not increase the modification of the proposed Amendment.

Section 2 RULES. Roberts: Rules of Order, Revised shall govern all points not specifically covered by these By-Laws.

ARTICLE III - BOARD OF DIRECTORS

Section 1 NUMBER. The Board of Directors shall consist of nine (9) persons elected in accordance with section 3 of this Article, and shall have full power to manage affairs of this organization, subject to the provisions of law and these By-Laws. They shall make such rules and regulations as they deem proper to carry on the business of this organization.

Section 2 TERM Three (3) directors shall be elected each year. Each director shall serve for three years, from July 1st following his or her election or until his or her successor has been elected and qualified. In the event that any directors have been appointed to fill vacanies, as provided in Section 6 of this Article, additional directors shall be nominated and elected, as set forth in Section 3 of the Article.

Section 3 NOMINATION AND ELECTION. (Fifth paragraph)

A director who has served a full three year term may not not be reelected until one (1) year after expiration of his or her term. Directors shall serve without compensation.

Section 5 QUORUM Five (5) directors shall constitute a quorum, at any meeting of the Board of Directors. Seven (7) directors shall constitute a quorum for the transation of any business by mail or telephone.

PROPOSED CHANGES.

ARTICLE III - BOARD OF DIRECTORS

Section 1 NUMBER. The Board of Directors shall consist of six (6) persons elected in accordance with Section 3 of this Article, and shall have full power to manage the affairs of this organization, subject to the provisions of law and these By-Laws. They shall make such rules and regulations as

they deem proper to carry on the business of this organization.

Section 2 TERM

Three directors shall be elected each year except
the year ending June, 1965, when no new directors shall be
shall be elected. Each director shall serve for two
years, from July 1st following his on her election
or until his or her successor has been elected and qualified. In the event that any directors have been
appointed to fill vacanies, as provided in Section 6
of this Article, additional directors shall be nominated and elected as set forth in Section 3 of this
Article.

Section 3 NOMINATION AND ELECTION. (Fifth paragraph)

A director who has served a full two uear ter, including those who have already served three years by June, 1965, may not be reelected until one (1) year after expiration of his or her term. Directors shall serve without compensation.

Section 5 QUORUM. Four (4) directors shall constitute a quorum, at any meeting of the Board of Directors. Five (5) directors shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of any business by mayl or paperhone.

Members of the club will be asked to vote on these changes at the April meeting.

Your President-Editor is a member of Stereo Circuit #9. One of the most well-known and respected stereo shooters in this circuit is Paul Darnell. He is a mathematician who works for the Telephone Company and when one of the members of the circuit submitted a slide which lacked considerable in viewing comfort, he asked Paul to analyze his problem and tell him how to avoid future shots such as this. As I recall the picture, it was a close-up of a group of flowers in which the nearest line of flowers came through the window and the separation of the flowers at stereo infinity was too great for viewing comfort. Paul went into a great deal of trouble to describe mathematically what was wrong with the picture. He considered the type of camera which took the picture, the focal length of the lenses, the interocular separation, the degree of magnification for a 50 inch screen, the near distance, the far distance, and many formulae which I will not repeat here. If some of you are interested in having the summing up of this information available to carry in your gadget bag, I am reprinting part of it herewith as a guide to help in taking pictures which will project well and take a minimum of remounting or masking.

The inting of this bulletin was interrupted March 2nd to have a Board of Director's meeting at which, among other things, the problem of obtaining three more members of the oil willing to serve on the Board was discussed. Every member of the club was also d and with the possible exception of a limited few, were contacted by Art Illeia, Chairman of the Nominations Committee. Since no members were found, willing to boild, it was decided that the only practical manner in which to handle the situation is to reduce the number of directors from 9 to 6, and reduce their term of critice from 3 years to 2. Until such time as we have a greater number of willing and active workers, our Board structure seems a bit too elaborate for the size of the club. Hence a written resolution was presented to the Board who approved it, applied to final membership approval. By-Laws require the changes to be included in the northly publication so that all members are aware of the situation and can vote incelligently on the issue when presented at the regular meeting.

The proposed changes entail ARTICLE III Amendments. The present By-Laws will be outlined with the changes appearing at the end with changes underlined.

ARTICLE III - BOARD OF DIRECTORS

- Setion 1 NUMBER. The Board of Directors shall consist of nine (9) persons elected in accordance with section 3 of this Article, and shall have full power to manage affairs of this organization, subject to the provisions of law and these By-Laws. They shall make such rules and regulations as they deem proper to carry on the business of this organization.
- tetion 2 TERM. Three (3) directors shall be elected each year. Each director

shall serve for three years, from July 1st following his or her election or until his or her successor has been elected and qualified. In the event that any directors have been appointed to fill vacancies, as provided in Section 6 of this Article, additional directors shall be nominated and elected, as set forth in Section 3 of this Article.

Section 3 NOMINATION AND ELECTION. (Fifth paragraph)

A director who has served a full three year term may not be reelected until one (1) year after expiration of his or her term. Directors shall serve without compensation.

Section 5 QUORUM. Five (5) directors shall constitute a quorum, at any meeting of the Board of Directors. Seven (7) directors shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of any business by mail or telephone.

PROPOSED CHANGES:

ARTICLE III - BOARD OF DIRECTORS

- Section 1 NUMBER. The Board of Directors shall consist of six (6) persons elected in accordance with Section 3 of this Article, and shall have full power to manage the affairs of this organization, subject to the provisions of law and these By-Laws. They shall make such rules and regulations as they deem proper to carry on the business of this organization.
- Section TERM. Three directors shall be elected each year except the year ending June, 1935, when no new directors shall be elected. Each director shall serve for two years, from July 1st following his or her election or until his or her successor has been elected andqualified. In the event that any directors have been appointed to fill vacancies, as provided in Section 6 of this Article, additional directors shall be nominated and elected as set forth in Section 3 of this Article.
- Section 3 NOMINATION AND ELECTION. (Fifth paragraph)

A director who has served a full two year term, including those who have already served three years by June, 1965, may not be reelected until ons (1) year after expiration of his or her term. Directors shall serve without compensation.

Section of QUORUM. Four (h) directors shall constitute a quorum, at any meeting of the Board of Directors. Five (5) directors shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of any business by mail or telephone.

Members of the club will be asked to vote on these changes at the April meeting.

Since it is almost 1:00 A.M. and your Editor is making too many mistakes, this will be the end of this bulletin.

It can be stated at this time, that all officers except a Secretary have been slated, and we hope to have that job filled at an early date.

Here are the proposed changes:

ARTICLE III - BOARD OF DIRECTORS

Section 1 NUMBER. The Board of Directors shall consist of four (4) persons namely President, Vice President, Secretary and Treasurer. shall be elected in accordance with Section 3 of this Article, and shall have full power to manage the affairs of this organization. subject to the provisions of law and these By-Laws. They shall make such rules and regulations as they deem proper to carry on the business of this organization.

- Section 2 TERM. The directors shall serve for one year, from July 1st, following his or her election or until a successor has been elected and qualified. Re-election is permissable.
- Section 3 NOMINATION AND ELECTION. Paragraph 1, 2, 3 no changes.

 Paragraph 4. Election of directors shall take place at the last general meeting of June each year. If more nominations are made from the floor, election shall be by secret ballot. The President shall appoint three (3) tellers to count the ballots and announce the results.
- Section 4 BOARD MEETINGS. The Board of Directors shall hold meetings periodically, at the call of the President, or at the call of two directors.
- Section 5 QUORUM. Three (3) directors shall constitute a quorum, at any meeting of the Board of Directors.
- Section 7 OFFICERS. (This section of old By-Laws eliminated)
- Section 7 COMPENSATION. (Same as old section 8)
- Section 8 SPECIAL MEETINGS. (Same as old section 9)

As soon as possible, we will have a new stencil cut with the latest changes, pending approval of the club, so all members may have a copy.

REPORT ON STEREO DIVISION ACTIVITIES

AT THE P. S. A. CONVENTION - DENVER

The following members of The Stereo Club of Southern California were observed by your reporter attending the various Stereo Activities at Denver: LEWIS W. BUTTER# FIELD, JAMES H. DINWIDDIE, LESTER LAUCK, BERT and CATHERINE LAURSEN, HAROLD LIOYD, ARTHUR and MARIAM NEILL, CHARLES and MAUDE OSBORN, STERGIS M. STERGIS and MRS. STERGIS, SYLVIA SIKES.

Staty five (65) HUMOR slides competed for the HAROLD LLOYD "HUMOR SLIDE AWARD" furnished by Harold Lloyd, APSA, Mrs Ruth Bauer, FPSA, was the Chairman of this competition, and presided at this program. After much deliberation by the three judges, a slide by VIC PAGEL of Milwaukee, Wisconsin was chosen as depicting the DEST HUMOR.

The showing of the PSA International Stereo Salon had the usual perfect projection, with the efficient Chicago Stereo Camera Club group at the controls. Since two out of three of the judges, who selected the show, liked nudes, there was an over abundance of them chosen for public showings.

SOL SIEGIE, Director of the "Realist Slide of the Year Award" was unable to attend, Conrad Hodnik, FRSA, presided. The judges again chose one of Vic Pagel's slides to be the best of all medal and award winning slides from the past year's Internationals submitted for consideration.

When it comes to the "Stereo Sequence Awards" conducted by Lee Hon, FFSA, the usual tention prevailed among those who submitted. (The winners are not announced untill the show is on). Unfortunately, this year, there were far too few sequences submitted, for the judges to have much choice in their selection. Our CONGRATULATIONS to ART and MARIAN NEILL who won 1st Place with their sequence entitled "Trees". This is the third consecutive year for the NEILL'S to take the 1st Place Award. Think we should have them give us a program on their technique?

I did not see ART and MARIAN'S program "Kindar Capers" but I am sure it was up to their usual high standards.

Nor did I see "On Stereo's Magic Carpet", put on by Harold Lloyd's Happy Seven. However, I understand the room was overflowing with curious spectators hoping, if nothing else, to get to see Harold Lloyd. I heard tell, that to reduce the crowd, some one made a public request for all Califorians to leave so that "out of state people" could see the show. The projection controls for this show were also handled by the Chicago Stereo Camera Club crew.

For those who entered the Stereo Division, PSA Denver International, Lewis F. Miller, FPSA, conducted a very worth while "Panel Discussion" of "Why Rejects?". I believe everyone present, who entered in this Salon, had a "near miss" slide which was given constructive comments. One of the biggest objections was the use of "Red Attire" on their models. Let this be a lesson to all of us - there are many other hues in the color spectrum.

Last, and by far the BEST program I saw was, "Montages In Stereo" by Mrs. Helen W. Erskine, APSA. To me, this program of instructions in mounting and the making of Montages, with illustrated slides, was well worth the time and money spent to attend the convention.

To me, these conventions are not only to meet and visit with friends, but to learn more about how we can improve our hobby - PHOTOGRAPHY.

THE PSA STEREO DIVISION DINNER had the largest attendence of any ever held by this Division. A TOTAL OF 130 ATTENDED. It is at this festive Stereo gathering that all of the various Awards and Certificates are presented.

Our "Hats - Off" to EVERETT HUFFINE, FSLC, a Stereo Division Director for the past five years, who received a Certificate of Award for his outstanding work as Director of the PSA National Club Stereo Competitions. Over the past five years, he has injected far better participation in this activity.

But our GREATEST CONGRATULATIONS go to EVERETT HUFFINE for receiving a "STEREO DIVISION SERVICE AWARD", the Divisions highest honor, awarded only to members in the Stereo Division, giving Special Recognition for exceptional and valued service to Stereo Photography and the Stereo Division of the Photographic society of America. Believe me, this Service Award is hard to get, — In fact in a lot of ways, I think it is far harder to get than an APSA, as there are so few awarded each year.

To sum up briefly, the rules as outlined in the December 1963 STEREOGRAM, a Stereo Division Service Awards Committee of five (5) members, select the person or persons to be so honored. To keep this Award exclusive, and held in high esteem, no more than four (4) certificates are given in any one year. Also since takes a majority vote of a five person Committee to pass on these awards, there could be some years that no such award is given. Last year and this year there were only three given each year.

Any member is eligible to propose another member for this HONOR, but in addition to the "proposer", there must be two sponsor members who are willing to varify the record of the member being proposed. All, of this has to be made up in five copies, (original and four copies) and sent to the Chairman of the Stereo Diwision Awards Committee, on or before May 1st each year, to give the committee time to act.

Then here is the hard part. The person proposed, is to know nothing about this, and no one but the Chairman of this committee and the Stereo Division Chairman know who has been selected for this high honor untill the announcement and presentation is made at the Convention Stereo Division Dinner.

Everett had made plans to attend the Convention, but due to the critical illness, and later death of his mother, he was unable to attend. I was indeed happy I was present at the dinner, and was asked to accept these honors for Everett. I know all in attendence, from our Club were happy they were personal friends of the Huffine's.
