Minutes of the second Board of Directors Meeting, February 6, 1961

The second Board of Directors meeting was held at the home of Elmer Weidknecht on February 6, 1961.

Discussion followed on how to get the members to become better acquainted and it was suggested that the older members attempt to help with this problem. Russ Terrill said he thought it might be a good idea to have someone at the next field trip demonstrate the use of a slide bar for taking closeup pictures.

Mr. Butterfield was asked to check on the present status of the Club insurance policy with the Routherman & Story Ins. Co. covering equipment. This he agreed to do and would make his report when done.

Next on the agenda was the subject of whether or not to continue the club contests. Minutes of Board of Directors Meeting, July 20, 1961.

A meeting of the new and old Board of Directors was called to order by President Sylvia Sikes at 8.15 PM, July 20th, 1961 at Plummer Park.

### COMPETITION RULES

- 1. There will be FIVE (5) club competitions during the year: September, November, February, March, and May.
- 2. FOUR (4) slides may be entered by a member in each contest. Only paid up members are eligible to submit slides.
- 3. Each slide must be mounted in glass, labeled with the maker's name, and titled. Slides must be thumb-marked in the lower left hand corner as properly viewed in a hand viewer, and shall be marked 1, 2, 3, 4, as the maker wants them shown. Comments will be made on all slides, time permitting. Comments will start with the lowest scoring slides and work up as far as possible.
- 4. Members of the club may be asked to serve as judges for the contests, in which event he or she may NOT submit slides in that particular contest, but may submit EIGHT (8) slides at the next contest.
- No member will be given more than one ribbon at any one contest. Only the highest scoring slide will be considered for this ribbon, and in case there is a tie, the judge will select the one he thinks is the best. All points won by the slides will be given to the contestant, and any slide which does not receive a ribbon may be submitted at a future contest.
- 6. No slide which has won a ribbon, Award, or Honorable Mention may be submitted for future club competition. No slide by the same maker which closely resembles a winning slide shall be eligible for competition.
- 7. All slides submitted for the club contest shall be eligible for and available to the Chairman for use to represent the club in Council and National P.S.A. Club competitions.
- 8. Scoring will be in the range of 1 to 5 inclusive in each of the following categories: STEREO, COMPOSITION, TECHNIQUE, and INTEREST or APPEAL.
- 9. In addition to the scoring in the above paragraph by the judge, each contestant will automatically receive TEN (10) points for entering the required number of slides.
- 10. Each member shall receive an additional TEN (10) points each for submitting the FOUR (4) slides eligible for both S4C Council and P.S.A.Club Competition.
- 11. It is also possible for each member to submit FOUR (4) slides for P.S.A. Club Competition which would not be eligible for S4C Council Competition. In this case the maker would receive only OME (1) TEN (10) point bonus.

DO YOU KNOW ....

That October and November are ideal months to visit the Monterey Peninsula? The distance is not too great from So. California, and there are picture possibilities everywhere you turn...ocean, lighthouses, tidal pools, rocks, birds, fishing fleet, dunes, flowers, clouds, missions, cultivated fields, and last but not least, there are the "butterfly trees".

Each year in October the scenic community of Pacific Grove (between Monterey and Carmel) watches a certain few of its many pine trees burst into brilliant orange color. It is not the pine needles turning, nor a special variety of blossom, but butterflies. Big beautiful Monarch Butterflies literally swarm over the few special trees, hanging by the thousands in large clusters from every branch. They return year after year, after travelling thousands of miles from the Canadian Rockies and Southern Alaska. They find their way unerringly to the very same trees that their parents had rested upon the previous year. The reason for the migration is plain. The butterflies, like birds, fly south to the warmer climate to escape the cold northern winters. Taking the shortest route from Canada, the butterflies appear over Monterey Bay as a strange cloud each October. The air current which helps waft them along apparently ends here and they swarm toward the land. The dark cloud becomes an orange and black one as they approach. They usually are here until March, when they begin their long flight back to Canada and Alaska to lay their eggs and die. Viewing this spectacle is one of the most awe-inspiring experiences you will ever have - why not plan a trip up that way this fall?

The 1961 Convention of the Photographic Society of America has just been concluded in New York City, and it was our good fortune to have been in attendance. For some of our newer members - and some older ones who may not know much about PSA, here are a few facts.

PSA, the Photographic Society of America, is the largest group of its kind, though not the oldest, in the world. Present membership is composed of more than ten thousand photographers, both amateur and professional, Camera Clubs, and Councils. It is a non-profit organization with all officers and officials elected by the membership for two year terms to serve without pay. It owns its Philadelphia Headquarters, and publishes the PSA Journal which is received monthly by every member.

There are at present seven National Divisions within the Society....COLOR (of which Merle S.Ewell, FPSA, is a past Chairman, and Maury Lank, APSA, is the present Chairman) MOTION PICTURE, NATURE, PHOTO-JOURNALISM, PICTORIAL, TECHNIQUES, AND STEREO (of which Elyga Wenger is currently the Secretary). These Divisions serve in a great number of ways most any particular interest a member or group may have. All of these are listed at the back of each Journal. These facilities offer a great deal more than any one member can encompass, which is to say the benefits of membership depend entirely upon his interest, activity and participation.

Annual dues are \$12.00 and includes membership in any one chosen division. Additional division memberships may be had for \$1.25 each per year. A husband and wife may belong jointly for \$18.00, including two divisions.

The 1962 Convention will be held in San Francisco from August 14th thru the 18th - why not make plans to attend?

TRY THIS ONE (in case you didn't already know it)..... Have you ever found a long, horizontal scratch on part of a film? You can reduce the chances of this happening if you will set your camera at "Infinity" before you roll the film back onto the original spool. This moves the pressure plate to the position where it is least likely to cause any scratching of the sensitive emulsion.

ONE FINAL TIP - and one to which some thought should be given in view of the disastrous conflagration which our area has recently experienced....

The stereo camera can be used as a very fine medium for making an insurance inventory of each and every room in a home, office, warehouse, etc. With Type A film and a flash point the camera toward each opposite corner, thus getting everything in the picture, including cabinets, dressers and all the furnishings. Where rooms have closets with clothing and other valuables, open the closet doors so that the contents can be photographed. Be sure and date each film and put slides in a safe deposite box. Seeing a cabinet, closet, china cabinet, etc. in a picture should refresh one's memory as to its contents, in case of destruction, fire or robbery. Beside this, it gives us all a lot of practice taking flash pictures.

....FROM KODAK'S COLOR PRINT AND PROCESSING (DEALERS' HOUSE ORGAN)

When customers ask you why their children have red eyes - when they are photographed in color - you may explain that the film records only what the camera sees.

The pupils of our eyes appear black only because there is ordinarily no interior illumination. When light shines directly into the eyes, as during a flash exposure, the retina reflects red light back toward the camera.

The remedy? Keep the room lights on brightly in order to keep the pupils of the eyes of your subjects from dilating. A small pupil opening is less likely to permit a reflection of light from the interior of the eye back into the lens. (Room lights will not affect the flash exposure.)

Have people - children especially - doing something interesting. We all look more attractive when we are not just staring at the camera! The best pictures show the children playing with a new toy or dad finishing the Hi-Fi cabinet he has just built in the home workshop. Remember, too, that some of the most pleasing pictures are profile shots, when eyes cannot possibly be red.

NOTE FROM EDITOR: So let's not see any RED EYES in those Christmas pictures you're going to be shooting very soon now. And while we're on the subject, your Editor and her "bulletin runner-offer" (who in his spare time mingles with the "flatties") would like to take this opportunity to WISH EACH OF YOU A HAPPY, HAPPY HOLIDAY SEASON!!!
