

Approved by The Board of Directors July 23, 1972

1. There shall be 5 competitions during the Fiscal year: namely Sept. Oct. Jan. Mar. & May.
2. There shall be three (3) groups: AA, A & B. Member's classification shall be assigned by a committee. Qualifications for each group shall be as follows:
  - AA - For advanced stereographers or those who have attained three star rating or higher.
  - A - For those less experienced or who have attained one or two star rating.
  - B - For the beginners, those less experienced, or new members, unless they choose a more advanced group.
3. Group AA, A and B slides shall be judged separately in this order. Comments shall be made on the "B" group only after all slides are scored.
4. Four slides may be entered by each member in each competition.
5. All slides should be mounted in glass. To encourage beginners to enter, and for less experienced, this requirement may be waived for group "B" competitors who choose to enter slides in cardboard mounts. However, they should show inclination or interest in learning to mount slides in metal masks at least, and preferably glass.
6. Slides should be spotted in lower left hand corner as viewed in an upright position. The projection crew and competition chairman shall assume no responsibility for incorrect projection of slides submitted that are not spotted or those incorrectly spotted.
7. Projection controls should be used during all club competitions, and one person shall be in charge of the projection control crew to see that they are making proper adjustments to the slides.
8. There shall be one or two night sessions of instructions for those who want to learn or already know how to operate the projection controls. Only those who have attended one of these sessions shall be allowed to operate the controls for club competitions.
9. There should be three stereo judges for each competition. A member of the club who is judging shall not submit slides that night and he shall receive a prorated score based upon the other 4 competitions of the fiscal year.
10. No make-up slides will be allowed for competitions missed. If unable to attend competition, slides should be mailed in advance to competition chairman, or given to a member to bring for competition. Dire circumstances shall be ruled upon by the competition chairman.
11. The following slides are not eligible for competition in Stereo Club of So. California.
  - a - Those that have previously received Awards or Honorable Mentions in any club. anywhere in the U.S., slide of the year competitions, or PSA Nat'l. Club Competitions.
  - b - Slides previously entered in club competition may never be entered again.
  - c - Slides previously entered in S4C may not be entered.
  - d - Slides previously entered in any PSA Nat'l. Club Competition through any Camera Club may not be entered.
  - e - Slides previously accepted in International Exhibitions may not be entered.
  - f - Similar slides previously entered whether titled the same or different title may not be entered.
12. Scoring shall be from 3 to 7 points.
13. Selection of honors in each group shall be as follows:
  - AWARDS - 5% of total slides entered.
  - HONORABLE MENTIONS - 10% of total slides entered.The honor slides shall be selected from at least 30% of the highest scoring slides, or from at least twice the number of slides to be selected for these honors. This is basically the same requirements set out in PSA-SD "Aids & Standards" for International Exhibitions. The AWARD ribbon slides shall be selected first, and then the Honorable Mentions shall be selected. This method to be followed in each group separately.
14. The three highest accumulated scores in each group at the end of the fiscal club year shall each be awarded a trophy or medal presented at the Annual Banquet.
15. Rules for "Slide of the Year" competition shall be with the approval of the Executive Board, and announced later in the club year.

MINUTES OF BOARD MEETING

January 26, 1972

Lester Lauck, chairman, called the meeting to order. The minutes of the last meeting were read and approved.

He first thanked Stergis Stergis for having the meeting in his home.

Joe Abramson gave the Treasurer's report and reported a balance as of Jan. 26, 1972 of \$485.77. It was moved, seconded and carried to accept the report. He next presented bills for payment and they were approved and ordered paid.

Bert Laursen reported on the S4C Delegate's Meeting and stated that S4C plans to raise the dues beginning in July of 1972 to \$2.00. This is an increase of 50¢ per person and is the first raise in many years and is something that seems in order.

It was stated that Ward Clark took the Club projector home to repair the carrier assembly.

Conrad Hodnik will bring us the next program which will be in April.

A letter from Russ Terrill stated the auto races would not really be too good for stereo slides and would not be a good field trip. Lester asked Bryan about the bicycle races held at the velodrome in Van Nuys as a possible field trip. Bryan will get necessary information and report at a later date. The motorcycle races were also discussed. These are held in Orange and Gladys said she would get necessary information regarding these.

Lester stated the wildflowers should be good in May at Yucca Valley and said we would have a field trip there at that time.

Charles Osborn said that Scripps' Oceanarium at LaJolla has some beautiful tide pool exhibits that can be photographed through the glass cases. It was decided to plan on a field trip Saturday, March 4, shooting these tide pools and other marine subjects in the morning and then taking pictures of the gliders at Torrey Pines in the afternoon, weather permitting. Between the two events a picnic lunch will be enjoyed at Torrey Pines picnic grounds.

Stergis presented four new names for approval for membership. They were Floyd Williamson, a member returned, Clara and Parke Hyde and Raymond Harvey. It was moved, seconded and carried to accept the four new members.

Marjorie Adams, competition chairman, stated everything is going well. She did have some trouble securing judges for the last competition since two of her judges were down with the flu. She thanked Gerald Church for filling in at the last minute. Scores for all competitions are to be given to the editor of the 3-D News as soon after the competition as possible. This includes the PSA competitions.

It was pointed out by Joe Abramson that S4C has asked if we could change our regular meeting night from the 2nd Friday to the 3rd Friday. After some discussion it was unanimously decided to leave it on the 2nd Friday.

A matter of getting a stereo worker to serve on the S4C Board for the coming term was discussed. Joe state he had already contacted Dorothy Hodnik, FPSA and she was willing to serve so her name has been submitted to S4C. The names of Floyd Garton and Charles Piper were also suggested and approved.

The matter of the one-half year dues for the Hodniks was discussed. Since they joined our group in November it was decided to let it stand as a full year membership. It was moved, seconded and carried to drop the matter.

The Club has the opportunity to buy new stereo glasses at 26¢ a pair and some Rotoviewers for use at the County Fair. The Fair budget gives the Stereo Division \$75.00 and the 1972 Chairman, Sylvia Sikes, APSA, asked the club to consider the purchase of one or two Rotoviewers at the present time and the budget would take care of at least one of them. It was moved by Bert and seconded by Stergis to buy one of the Viewers for \$40.00. The Motion carried. It was further moved by Bert to purchase 300 glasses and hold for reserve. Marjorie Adams seconded the motion and it carried.

Lester next appointed the nominating committee: Elmer Weidknecht, Bert Laursen and Stergis Stergis.

Gladys read Sylvia's report on the progress made to date for the L.A. County Fair Stereo Salon. There will be just one show of the accepted slides to be on August 17, 1972 at the regular meeting of the So. Calif. Stereo Club. It was moved and seconded to have this show. The motion carried. It was also moved, seconded and carried to have the show for the San Bernardino Stereo Salon on November 16. The S4C salon will be in November this year and no show date has been set as yet.

Catherine Laursen, hostess, stated that she wondered if anyone had suggestions regarding a different place to hold our July banquet. Everyone seemed to feel that Anthony's Red Vest was a good place and it was moved, seconded and carried to have the Annual Banquet on July 15, 1972 if that date could be obtained. Stergis said he would call and make the reservation.

March 22 was set for the next Board meeting and it will be at the Laursens.

There being no further business the meeting adjourned.

Joe Abramson, Asst. to the Field Trip Chrm., will be planning some workshops during the year, with emphasis on mounting and techniques of slide bar and Hyponar photography. There will also be a workshop at the Osborns sometime after the first of the year dealing with portraiture. Charles stated to help stimulate interest in field trip attendance he will donate a trophy for the best field trip or workshop slide. It was moved, seconded and carried to accept this offer. Requirements for this trophy are that the slide must never have been entered in any competition, anywhere prior to its entering this competition, and must be taken during the fiscal year. Members will be allowed to enter two slides. *per field trip on new trip.*

Russ Terrill, Banquet Chrm., stated he would be willing to investigate other restaurants where we might hold our Christmas Parties and Annual Banquets if the club desired a change. If our club grows in numbers much more it will be difficult to seat everyone comfortably and project pictures successfully at the Red Vest. However, after considerable discussion it was moved, seconded and carried to go to the Red Vest for the Christmas Party.

Bert Laursen, Program Chrm. stated he would secure programs for the open dates.

Stergis Stergis asked that other members besides himself contact members who have not been attending club meetings regularly. Oliver Dean, Vice President, stated he would be glad to assist the Membership Chrm. in this duty.

Connie Hodnik, PSA Nat'l. Club Competition Chrm., stated he will ask each member for six slides and from these he will select the best six slides to be sent in for Club competition. The remaining slides will be immediately returned to their respective makers.

The matter of whether we should raise our dues was discussed. It was pointed out that S/C was raising their dues. However, it was felt it would not be necessary for us to raise our dues at this time. They will remain, \$9.00 per single membership and \$15.00 for a couple.

Sylvia Sikes, Competition Chrm. asked if there were any more cards to hand out to prospective members. It seems our supply has been completely used up. -- She next stated she had gone over the present competition rules, which have been revised and changed numerous times, and decided to submit some new rules for the approval of the Board. She read these new, proposed rules in their entirety and then each rule was read separately, discussed and voted upon by the Board. They were all accepted with a few minor changes and a copy of the new rules are attached to these minutes. It was a job well done.

There being no further business the meeting adjourned and the group went to Arnolds for dinner.

COMPETITION RULES FOR YEAR 1972-73

Approved by The Board of Directors July 23, 1972

*Club file*

1. There shall be 5 competitions during the Fiscal year: namely Sept. Oct. Jan. Mar. & May.
2. There shall be three (3) groups: AA, A & B. Member's classification shall be assigned by a committee. Qualifications for each group shall be as follows:
  - AA - For advanced stereographers or those who have attained three star rating or higher.
  - A - For those less experienced or who have attained one or two star rating.
  - B - For the beginners, those less experienced, or new members, unless they choose a more advanced group.
3. Group AA, A and B slides shall be judged separately in this order. Comments shall be made on the "B" group only after all slides are scored.
4. Four slides may be entered by each member in each competition.
5. All slides should be mounted in glass. To encourage beginners to enter, and for less experienced, this requirement may be waived for group "B" competitors who choose to to enter slides in cardboard mounts. ~~However, they should show inclination or interest in learning to mount slides in metal masks at least, and preferably glass.~~
6. Slides should be spotted in lower left hand corner as viewed in an upright position. The projection crew and competition chairman shall assume no responsibility for incorrect projection of slides submitted that are not spotted or those incorrectly spotted.
7. ~~Projection controls should be used during all club competitions, and one person shall be in charge of the projection control crew to see that they are making proper adjustments to the slides.~~
8. There shall be one or two night sessions of instructions for those who want to learn or already know how to operate the projection controls. Only those who have attended one of these sessions shall be allowed to operate the controls for club competitions.
9. There ~~shall~~ <sup>shall</sup> be three stereo judges for each competition. A member of the club who is judging shall not submit slides that night and he shall receive a prorated score based upon the other 4 competitions of the fiscal year.
10. No make-up slides will be allowed for competitions missed. If unable to attend competition, slides should be mailed in advance to competition chairman, or given to a member to bring for competition. Dire circumstances shall be ruled upon by the competition chairman.
11. The following slides are not eligible for competition in Stereo Club of So. California.
  - a - Those that have previously received Awards or Honorable Mentions in any club, anywhere in the U.S., ~~slide of the year competitions~~, or PSA Nat'l. Club Competitions.
  - b - Slides previously entered in club competition may ~~never~~ <sup>not</sup> be entered again. *that year*
  - c - ~~Slides previously entered in S/C may not be entered.~~
  - d - Slides previously entered in any PSA Nat'l. Club Competition through any Camera Club may not be entered.
  - e - Slides previously accepted in International Exhibitions may not be entered.
  - f - Similar slides previously entered whether titled the same or different title may not be entered.
12. Scoring shall be from 3 to 9 points.
13. Selection of honors in each group shall be as follows:
  - AWARDS - 5% of total slides entered.
  - HONORABLE MENTIONS - 10% of total slides entered.

The honor slides shall be selected from at least 30% of the highest scoring slides, or from at least twice the number of slides to be selected for these honors. This is basically the same requirements set out in PSA-SD "Aids & Standards" for International Exhibitions. The AWARD ribbon slides shall be selected first, and then the Honorable Mentions shall be selected. This method to be followed in each group separately.
14. The three highest accumulated scores in each group at the end of the fiscal club year shall each be awarded a trophy or medal presented at the Annual Banquet.
15. Rules for "Slide of the Year" competition shall be with the approval of the Executive Board, and announced later in the club year.



Joe Abramson accepted the chairmanship of the 1973 L. A. County Fair Stereo Salon.


Charles Piper assisted by Stergis Stergis agreed to prepare the Club roster for 1972-73 which will include business phones of members.
