ARTICLE IV - OFFICERS

Section 1. BOARD OF DIRECTORS. The Board of Directors shall be made up of the President, Vice President, Secretary, Treasurer (the Elective Officers) and the Following Chairmen: Program Chairman, Competition Chairman, Hospitality Chairman, Membership Chairman, Workshop & Outing Chairman, Editor of the Club Bulletin, SAC Delegate and House Committee Chairman, and/or any other Chairmen deemed necessary by the Board of Directors for the smooth functioning of the Club affairs.

The Executive functions for the Club are handled by the Board of Directors.

Section 2. PRESIDENT. The President is Chairman of the Board of Directors and is the executive officer of the Club. The President shall preside at all regular and special meetings of the organization and, subject to the approval of the Board of Directors, shall have general control and management of the affairs of the organization and shall appoint all committees. He shall be ex-official member of all committees. The office is elective for a one-year term. Re-election is permissible but not more than two consecutive terms can be served.

VICE-PRESIDENT. Next in line of authority and acting chairman in the absence of the President is the Vice-President. The office is elective for a one year term. Re-election is permissible but not more than two consecutive terms may be served.

SECRETARY. Next in line of authority and acting chairman in the absence of both the president and Vice-President is the Secretary. He/she shall keep a record of all proceedings in regular and special meetings of the Board of Directors and within five (5) days after such meeting, he/she shall mail to the President a copy of the Minutes of the meeting. He/she shall send out all notices of regular or special meetings of the Board of Directors. He/she shall preform such other duties as are assigned to him/her by the Board of Directors. The office is elective for a one-year term. Re-Election is permissible but not more than two consecutive terms may be served.

TREASURER. The Treasurer shall sefely keep all monies of the organization that comes into his/her hands, from time to time, and pay out the same upon checks of the organization, for all bills duly contracted and authorized to be paid, and generally perform all duties pertaining to his/her office, or which may be required of him/her by the Board of Directors, He/she shall keep accurate books of account of all transcations of his/her office and shall make a report at all regular Director's meetings, or when requested by the president. This office is Elective for a one-year term. Re-election in permissible.

- Section 3. CHAIRMEN. The following chairmen are appointive by the President subject to the approval of the officers and chall hold office at the pleasure and discretion of the Elective Officers, but the term of appointment is not to exceed one year. The chairmen are members of the Board of Directors. Any chairman may be a member of the Board of Directors or chairman of one or more committees at the discretion of the Elective Officers.
- Section 4. PROGRAM CHAIRMAN. Lectures are of prime importance to the club. The Chairman shall arrange for lectures on subjects of interest to the members, other programs of general interest and in general work with the Competition Chairman to have a rounded program for the membership. This office is appointive and for a term of one year.

COMPETITION CHAIRMAN. The Competition Chairman will classify all slides and be responsible for the equipment necessary for proper handling of the slides for the meeting. He may, at his/her discretion, call upon members of the club for assistance in discharging these duties. He/she shall, with the approval of the Board of Directors, set up the point system to be followed, and issue ribbons and trophies or medals that may be earned under this system. He/she shall keep a record of the points given at the competitions and report from time to time the standing of the individual members in the accumulative scores of the year. This office is appointive and for a year term.

MOSPIEALITY CHAIRMAN. Realizing that the first impression of a visitor is generally a lasting impression, it shall be the duty of the Hospitality Chairman to meet all visitors, register their names in the club guest book and when called upon by the President, to introduce each to the club members. Should the visitors express a desire for information about joining the club, to introduce them to the Membership Chairman. This office is appointive and for a one year term.

MEMBERSHIP CHAIRMAN. It shall be the duty of the Membership Chairman to meet all visitors, advise of the aims and purposes of the club, and invite them to apply for membership in the club if they are interested. This office is appointive and for a one year term.

WORKSHOP & OUTING CHAIRMAN. It shall be the duty of the Workshop and Outing Chairman to arrange for meetings wherein all members may receive instructions and advice on various phases of photography - proper mounting of slides for better projection, lighting, table-top photography, etc. He/she should arrange to have two or more field trips during the year wherein the entire club enjoys an outing and an opportunity to become better acquainted with his fellow members and wherein all members have the same opportunity to take pictures under similar circumstances and conditions. This office is appointive and for a one year term.

EDITOR OF THE CLUB BULLETIN. The purpose of the Club Bulletin, is to serve as a medium of information to the members of the club for club activities, coming events, items of personal

interest about members, who will be the next judge or speaker, etc. It shall be the duty of the Editor to prepare and forward a monthly bulletin to each member. This office is appointive and for a one year term.

S4C DELEGATE. The club is a member of the Southern California Council of Camera Clubs. The club is represented at Council legislative meetings by a regularly appointed delegate, or a temporary alternate delegate. This office is appointive and for a term of one year.

HOUSE COMMITTEE CHAIRMAN. It shall be the duty of the House Committee Chairman to arrange the chairs, microphone, projector, screen, etc., for the presentation of the monthly judging or program. Me/she shall have a key to the club locker, where the club properties are stored and arrange for the return of the equipment to the locker after the meeting. This office is appointive and for a one year term.

The Chairmen shall attend all Board of Directors meetings and report on their respective activities when called for by the President.

Each Chairman may xxxx select any member of the club as his assistant, and/or ask for as many other helpers as necessary for the proper functioning of his office. These assistants or helpers may be invited to attend any or all Board meetings and voice constructive suggestions, however, voting on all issues will be restricted to the Chairman.

STEREO CLUB OF SCUTHERN CALIFORNIA

COMPETITION RULES & REGULATIONS

Revised July, 1967

- There shall be a Stereo Competition Committee. This Committee shall be under the supervision of a Chairman, who shall be appointed by the President of the Stereo Club of Southern California. He shall be known as the Competition Chairman.
- 2. The Competition Chairman shall conduct the bi-monthly competitions in conformity with the regulations set forth herewith.
- 3. There shall be FIVE (5) Intra-Club competitions during the year: September, October, January, March and May. The months here stated are subject to revision by the Board of Directors.
- 4. Slides, when submitted for judging should be mounted in glass, labeled with the maker's name and titled. Each slide must be thumb-marked in the lower left hand corner as property viewed in a hand viewer, and shall be marked 1, 2, 3, 4, as the maker wants them shown. An "AVERY" adhesive label is convenient for doing the spetting. Comments will be made on all slides, time permitting.
- 5. The persons invited to act as Judges at competition meetings, shall when possible, not be regular competing members of the Stereo Club. Obtaining the Judges shall be the responsibility of the Competition Chairman, however, he may appoint a member of the Stereo Club to act in this capacity.
- 6. The membership shall be divided into TWO (2) competitive groups and the members in any one group shall compete only with club members in the same group.

 Only members who are in good standing and have paid their currect annual dues, shall be eligible to compete in bi-monthly Stereo Club competitions.
- 7. The competition groups shall be as follows: "E" and "A".
- 8. At the end of each year, the two (2) members having the highest total annual accumulated scores in the "B" group, shall compete the following year in the "A" group. The two (2) members having the lowest scores in the "A" group may the following year compete in the "B" group. In the event that the persons having the lowest scores in the "A" group have not submitted slides to one or more of the competitions during the year, the Competition Chairman shall apply a score to such missed competitions, which score shall be the average of the competitions to which slides were submitted.
- 9. The "A" group shall remain the same from year to year, except as set forth in Rule 8 above. All members shall compete in the same group for an entire competition year.
- 10. Any member in the "B" group, upon his own request, may be assigned to the "A" group. New members shall be assigned to either the "B" or "A" group by the Competition Chairman subject to the approval of the board of directors/.
- The "B" and "A" groups shall not be judged separately, the slides of both groups shall be mixed. the Judge and members will not know to which group any particular slide belongs. After a slide is scored, it shall be assigned to it's proper place at the work table.

12. There shall be three trophies given each year for the first, second and third highest total accumulated annual scores in the "B" and "A" groups.

In May or June, of each year, there shall be a slide of the year competition, which shall be judged by three competent judges, outside of the local area, if possible.

Each member may submit slides of his own choosing in the Slide of the Year Competition.

The Competition Chairman shall provide each member with a list of the titles of slides that will be eligible for the Slide of the Year competition.

The number of slides that a member may enter, in the Slide of the Year Competition, shall each year be established by the Competition Chairman.

Each member shall submit his slides for the Slide of the Year Competition to the Competition Chairman for at least seven (7) days prior to the judging.

13. The Slide of the Year Competition shall be judged by a jury chosen by the Competition Chairman and shall be judged at a place and time to be established by the Competition Chairman.

There shall be a trophy awarded to both the "B" and "A" groups. These trophies will be denated to the Steree Club by member - MAX ERUENSTEINER.

The Top Ten (10) slides and Slide of the Year, in each group ("E" and "A") shall be shown each year at the Annual Banquet.

14. The top scoring slides in the bi-monthly competitions, in the "B" and "A" groups, shall be given Award and Monorable Mention ribbons. There shall be no limitation on the number of ribbons a member amy win at any competition.

Any slide that has won an award or honorable mention ribbon in any previous bi-monthly competition, shall not again be eligible for bi-monthly Stereo Club Competitions.

The top scoring slides in the "B" and "A" groups, shall receive Award Ribbons.

The slides scoring next highest to the Award slides in the "B" and "A" groups, shall reveive Honorable Mention ribbons, as determined by the Competition Chairman.

15. Each member shall reveive a BONUS of two (2) points for submitting a total of four (4) slides to the Competition Chairman at each competition meeting. These slides shall become part of the group from which the PSA Club Competition entrys are chosen.

The Competition Chairman shall, whenever possible, have a committee assist in selecting all entrys to PSA Club competitions. The Competition Chairman may hold any or all slides entered in a Stereo Club competition for consideration for PSA club competition. The selecting of entrys to PSA Inter-

Club competition, shall be the responsibility of the Competition Chairman, who may assign to another Steree Club member the responsibility for the activity. The slides held for the purpose herevith outlined shall be returned as soon as is reasonable possible to the owner member.

16. We slide shall be eligible for Steree Club of So. Calif., Intra-Club competition, unless it is available, at will, for PSA club competitions.

No slide may be submitted in the bi-monthly competition that has received an Award or Henerable Mention, from another club, at SAC Club or Individual, or PSA club competition. Any member submitting slides in bi-monthly competitions in violation of the above, shall forfeit the points the slide received in said competition.

Also, should a slide which has previously received an Award or Menorable Mention at SAC Club or Individual or PSA club competitions, for this or any other camera club, be submitted for benus points, the maker will forfeit the two benus points.

Each member may submit Feur (4) slides at each Steree Club bi-menthly competition.

- 17. When a Storee Club member serves as a Judge, that person, or a family member shall not enter slides in the competition he is to judge. A person, so judging, and the family members may all submit eight (8) slides at a subsequent competition.
- 18. The same slide may not be entered more than twice in Intra-Club competitions in any one competition year.

Slides that are basically the same as slides that have received Award or Honorable Mentions, shall not be entered in Intra-Club competitions.

All Steree Club competitions shall be scered on a single range of Three(3) to NINE (9) points.

One to three Judges shall be used to judge each competition.

Each member shall prepare entry forms IN DUPLICATE, furnished by the club, covering slides to be entered in a regular competition. The entry form shall be a puz part of the slide entry.

USING THE STEREO CAMERA

By - JULIUS WOLF, APSA

Every time we project the Lighthouse Show people marvel at the breathtaking reality of what they see on the screen. A successful salon slide in 35 mm color is sometimes just a "lucky" shot. This is not likely to happen with STEREO. What is the secret of making a winning slide for 3-D competition? There are three steps inevolved in this endeavor: FIRST: taking the picture, SECOND, mounting the slide. THIRD, projecting the slide. Each step requires painstaking care and know-how. The first step is the most important because there is little you can do with mounting or projection that will rescue a poorly taken slide. This article will deal only with the first step, using the Stereo Camera.

When you look at a landscape, your eyes see everything in focus, both near and far. Because we want our slides to look real, it is a must for ALL subject matter to be in sharp focus. There are some exceptions such as freezing water in motion, or indicating movement in an athletic event by a slight blurring effect. To attain over-all sharpness set "INF" on your depth of field dial under the "F" opening you intend to use, then, under the same "F" opening on the other side of the dial you can read the nearest distance the object will be in sharp focus. In most outdoor daylight photography, except for dark or overcast days or sunset afterglow, sharp pictures can be taken with a camera hand-held at 1/100 second, or in a few cases at 1/50 second. When any slower speed is indicated it is necessary to use a trie pod. An accurate lightmeter reading of the important area of your picture is an absolute necessity. Perhaps the easiest way to do this is to take a meter reading on some nearby surface of similar color and lighting to that of your cominant picture area.

In any field of photography, pictorial composition has top priority. A comprehensive discussion of this subject is not possible within the space alloted to this article. At least we can suggest that you avoid slanting horizons, horizons that split the picture into halves, centers of interest in the center format, too many centers of interest, cutting off heads and feet or showing buildings or structures without bases. If the sky is overcast you don't want much of it in your picture. Often it is better to leave it out altogether. Balance of mass and color is just as important in this medium as it is in 35 mm pictures. A good stereo slide, however, needs something more. It must have good composition in space.

Much of the impact of stereo depends on the depth or 3-D effect. Your eyes are capable of seeing objects in true stereo for distances up to 100 feet. Beyond this distance you see, in depth, what you know is there. An ideal landscape for exciting depth effect would have an interesting foreground object followed by a succession of objects in verticle planes stretching out for 50 to 100 feet in the scene. The foreground object or frame should be attractive but not so complex or glamorous that your eyes are reluctant to move on into the main part of the picture. One problem peculiar to this medium is the diminished intensity on the screen due to polarizing elements in the projector and in the viewing glasses. Under-exposed transparencies, quite popular in 35 mm color, are too dark for stereo. Also, it is best to avoid large dark areas because they project with little or no detail. Some low-angle shots taken with the camera near the ground give the impression of a "worm's eye" view on the screen.

It is a good idea to have your foreground object 10 to 12 feet from the camera. Then, if you learn how to mount the transparencies to bring the main scene nearer to the window, your nearby object (often a tree) will not appear to break off in space. Finally, beware of nearby objects pointing straight at the camera such as a face close-up looking right at the lens or someone holding an object directly at you. Slides of this kind will show grotesque distortion on the screen. Nothing you can do with mounting or projection will eliminate this distortion. What ever has been written so far in this article is intended to help you use your stereo camera to make slides that will usually look good in the hand-viewer and sometimes on the screen.

If any one wants to become a serious competitor in club contests or Internationals he must learn the techniques of mounting and projecting slides AFTER he has massetered the camera. Instructive articles can be found in the past issues of the "FLASH", and workshop sessions will help a lot. Any member can learn more about projecting from most of the contest crew or by asking questions of older members. Even if you don't intend to compete you will find that you and your friends will love the way your slides look on the screen after you have mastered the three steps.

MONOCHROME PRINT DIVISION COMPETITION FOR CLUBS **RULES 1967-68**

1. There will be ten (10) monthly competitions. Soid Competitions will be held at the Edison Co. Auditorium, 601 W. 5th St., L.A.; Aug. 11, Sept. 8, Oct. 13, Nov. 10, Dec. 8, 1967; Jam. 12, Feb. 9, Mar. 8, Apr 12, and May 17, 1968.

2. Each member club may enter four (4) prints Each print must be the sole work (mounting excepted) of an individual who is an active member of the club and who is registered with S4C from that club.

3. No more than one (1) print to a maker per club to which he or she belongs.

4. Entry cards, furnished by the Council, must accompany the prints when submitted for competition. Each card must be properly filled out with all data requested.

5. Each print must have affixed to the back—a sticker, furnished by the council, bearing the print title, maker's name, name of member club, date and the club code num-

6. All prints must be mounted on standard 16x20-inch mounts, either horizontally or vertically; the sticker on the back shall be affixed so as to indicate the viewing positionwhen held in normal reading position. Prints may be any size.

7. Prints that have prevously won Award or Honorable Mentions in S4C Monthly Compettiions (in any group) may not be entered again. Likewise prints which are similar to said winners should not be entered as they too run the risk of being declared ineligible.
"It should be recognzed that minor variations on a single specific subject do not offer enough originality to be classed as additional pictures." (From Report of Ethics Committee, 1959).

8. Three (3) competent judges will be selected each month by the director responsible for obtaining judges. Prints will be scored on a basis of three (3) to nine (9) points by each judge.

9. The A and B Groups will be judged separately. After the scoring—the top three (3) prints in each group and all tying with the third print, will be designated Award Prints. The next highest five (5) and all tying with the fifth print, will be designated Honorable Mention Prints. In case the distribution greatly exceeds this number, a fewer number may be selected at the discretion of the Print Committee. All Award and H.M. Prints will be awarded gold stickers, which will be affixed to the back of the print by the print chmn.

10. Twenty-five percent (25%) of the prints of either A or B group will be shown to the judges before the judging begins.

11. The top-scoring prints not receiving Awards or H.M.s will be commented upon by the judges as time permits.

12. If necessary, entries may be sent to the print chmn. Mailed entries must have properly filled-out strickers affixed to the prints and must include an entry card. Return labels and return postage must be in-

13. The Print Committee will exercise all possible care in handling prints, however, no responsibility for loss or damage will be

14. The Print Chmn and his assistant will be the final authority in settling all questions and disputes which might arise, as to eligibility of entries or interpretation of the rules.

15. Competitions will be divided into two (2) groups, A and B. The following clubs will compete in A Group: Alhambra, Circle of Confusion, Click Chicks, Foothill, Glendale, Inner Circle, Los Angeles Camera Club, Los Angeles Photo. Soc., Pan Graphic, San Fernando Valley Shutterbusters, South Bay and Viewfinders. All clubs not listed and all new clubs will compete n B Group unless permission granted by Print Chmn to compete in a different group.

16. A club may compete in two divisions if they so desire providing a list of members is filed with the Print Chmn.

17. Clubs shall be reclassifed as to group or groups in which they shall compete, at the beginning of each competition year, by the current competition chmn., based upon the skill and proficiency of the members; and so that the number of clubs in each group shall be approximately even. If any club has missed any one or more competitions in the previous year and not made-up for the missing competition, the Chmn shall determine whether it should be moved by dividing its total score by the number of competitions it entered and multiplying that figure by the total number of competitions during the year. Any club may choose, before the first competition, to move to a higher group; but not to a lower group.

18. A new club entering at the beginning of, or during a competition year, will be placed in Group B normally, but it may be placed in any higher group at its request; or the Chmn may require it to enter a higher group, if he determines its members be-

long in such higher group.

19. If a club should miss a competition due to an emergency, that entry will be accepted the following month in addition to regular

20. Submission of prints for competition by clubs or their members will be considered as an acceptance of all the foregoing rules. -Note: Club code numbers shall be assigned to unassigned clubs at the first competition.



(1) DATE, TIME, LOCATION (a) There will be nine (9) monthly competitions. Aug. 8, Sept. 12, Nov. 14, Dec. 12, 1966; Jan. Feb. 13, Mar. 13, Apr. 10, and May 8, 1967, deleting Oct. for vacations and PSA conven-

(2) GENERAL RULES FOR SLIDES (ELIGI-BILITY) (a) No slide will be accepted for entry which has received an Honorable Mention or Award in any previous S4C Stereo Club or Individual Competition. (b) Each slide must be the sole work of the maker. (c) Minor variations on the same subject matter shall not constitute a different slide; the discretion of the stereo chairman and committee will decide concerning ethics of any rule involved. (d) The stereo committee will observe all possible care in handling slides. However, no responsibility for loss or damage will be assumed. (e) Slides should be glass mounted and thickness maintained to fit into a Triad slide carrier. Slides not fitting into Triad slide carrier will be returned for remounting. Slides in paper mounts will be projected as acceptably as is possible.

(3) GENERAL RULES FOR SLIDES (CLUB

AND INDIVIDUAL) (a) Each S4C Council Member Club shall be allowed to enter four (4) slides per club, but not more than one (1) slide per maker unless club has less than four (4) active stereo members. (b) Clubs with only three (3) active members will be allowed to enter two (2) slides for one (1) member and one (1) each for the other (2) members. (c) Clubs with only (2) active members will be allowed to enter two (2) slides per member. (d) In addition to the club competition, each S4C individual will be allowed to enter two (2) slides in the Individual Slide Competition. Since no competition is held in October, due to the PSA Convention, each club will enter double entries on November 14, 1966. Double entries will not be made for Individual Competition.

(4) LABELING (a) Please remove any excess tabs not relative to the competition entered. (b) Place an adequate white tab in the lower left hand corner of the slide as hand viewed, then turn the slide upside down so that the tab is in the upper right hand corner and print the following information legibly. For Club Slide Entries, show S4C Club Number on first line. See S4C News for club number. On second line show slide entry number (such as 1-2-3-4). For Individual Slide Entries show Individual Entry Number; (this will be assigned at time entry is received) on first line. On second line show slide entry number such as 1 or 2 C) Each Club or Individual will make out two (2) entry cards. One card will be retained by the S4C Stereo Division; the other entry card will be returned with scores filled in at close of competition. (d) Each slide must show maker's name, and slide title, both legibly printed.

(5) JUDGING (a) Three (3) competent judges will be selected each month by the Stereo Judge Chairman. All slides will be scored by each judge, from 1 to 9 points, making α minimum score of nine (9) points and α total maximum score of twenty-seven (27) points per slide. (b) All Club Slides will be judged before Individual Slide Competition.

(6) AWARDING (a) After all slides are scored, a suitable number of Award and Honorable Mention slides will be chosen from the top scoring slides. Appropriate ribbons will be awarded. (b) The Honorable Mention and Award Slides will be projected and the maker's name, title and club will be announced.

(7) COMMENT BY THE JUDGES (a) Brief comment will be made by the judge (s) on the near miss slides.

(8) RETURN OF SLIDES. (a) Slides will be returned to each Club or Individual at the conclusion of each monthly competition. (b) Slide entries may be mailed to the Stereo Chairman, Bert L. Laursen, 6460 Mantova, Long Beach, Calif., 90815. If it is impossible to bring them to the monthly competition, slides will be returned the following month, unless otherwise advised.

(9) YEAR END AWARDING AND RECORD-ING. (a) Monthly scores of each club will be reported in the S4C News each month following the competition. (b) Each Award and Honorable Mention slide maker will be given credit. (c) Scores for Individual Entries will be announced at the close of each monthly competition, but will not be listed each month in the S4C News. (d) All Honorable Mention and Award slides will be eligible for the year end Slide of the Year judging.
